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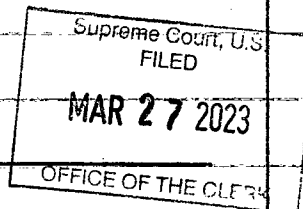

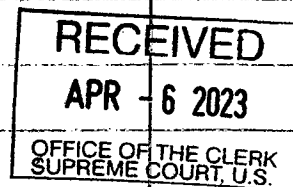

Pro Se Petitioner

Pursuant to Rule 13.5 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States the Petitioner pro se and indigent comes now respectfully requesting that this Honorable Supreme Court grant an extension of time to file a Petition for a writ of certiorari for a period of (60) sixty days from April 5, 2023 to July 5, 2023. On January 5, 2023 the Arizona Supreme Court denied the petitioners Petition for Review. The Petitioner was in "CDU" Detention at Huachuca Unit, Kingman Complex awaiting to be transferred when he received the attached opinion from the AZ Supreme Court. The Petitioner was finally transferred to Eyma complex-Meadows unit in Florence, AZ on January 25th, 2023. Once Petitioner was transferred to this facility he was placed in the assigned housing unit 6C-13L and was automatically "Re-assigned" to be a "Kitchen-cook Helper" and was on the Mon-Fri work sheet schedule from (2AM-8:30AM) and due to his work status, I had to be once again moved to another building 11B-9L. On March 21, 2023 I was removed from the kitchen due to an incident that had occurred and now I have enough time on my hands to actually focus and adequately prepare the Petition for a writ of certiorari. All these circumstances have actually hindered my ability to prepare and file the Petition for a writ of certiorari within (90) days as required by Rule 13, the (Petition for Review) is actually due on April 5, 2023 and the Petitioner needs more time to adequately prepare

the Petition for a writ of Certiorari.

Due to these circumstances the petitioner has been unable to access the law library and has had no access to the proper legal materials needed in order to prepare such writ. The Petition for a writ of certiorari is due by April 5th, 2023 and that is just not enough time for the Petitioner to adequately format and prepare the Petition.

The Petitioner who is indigent and pro se needs a sufficient amount of time to prepare the Petition for a writ of Certiorari and this court has jurisdiction to grant the relief requested. See, e.g., 28 U.S.C. § 2101(c) "A Justice of the Supreme Court, for good cause shown, may extend the time for applying for a writ of certiorari for a period not exceeding sixty days". See also, Rule 13.5 of the RULES OF THE Supreme Court of the United States.

The Petitioner plans to raise a question of Constitutional law that was left open in *Coleman v. Thompson*, 501 U.S. 722, 753-754, 755 (1991); *Martinez v. Ryan*, 566 U.S. 1 (2012): "Whether a prisoner (trial defendant) has a right to effective counsel in collateral proceedings which provide the first occasion to raise a claim of ineffective assistance at trial." This is going to be a complex task for Petitioner and he needs an additional ("60") sixty days to gather all the legal materials necessary to adequately prepare said petition.

This application to extend the time sets out the basis for jurisdiction in this court, and it identifies the judgment sought to be reviewed, and a copy of the opinion from the
