[*Wadhams v. American Federation of Teachers*. 22-40246. 5th Circuit Affirmed, 25 October 2022].


Cases in the courts of appeals may be reviewed by the Supreme Court by writ of certiorari granted upon the petition of any party to any civil or criminal case, before or after rendition of judgment or decree. 28 U.S. Code § 1254(1).

An extension is justified under extraordinary circumstances. The Petitioner timely filed a petition for certiorari [attached], and the requisite filing fee on Friday 20 January 2023, mistakenly believing the Supreme Court operates similarly to the Circuits where an electronic filing is accepted and then—absent technical or procedural problems—paper copies are requested.
