Dear Mr. Harris:

A response in this death penalty case is currently due May 22, 2024. Under Rule 30.4, Respondent respectfully requests that the time for filing a response be extended by thirty-days, up to and including June 21, 2024.

This is Respondent's second request for an extension in this case. The extension request is not sought for an improper purpose, including harassment or unnecessary delay.
