Dear Mr. Harris:

I am counsel of record for the Respondents in the case captioned above. My clients and I hereby request an extension of the time to file our Brief in Opposition to the Petition for Certiorari. The brief is currently due on June 6, 2024. We request an extension of 30 days, which would make it due Monday, July 8. Counsel for Petitioners advise that they do not oppose this request.

We request this extension for the following reasons. We are a small firm of four lawyers. I was lead counsel at trial in this matter, and before the Ninth Circuit on appeal, and am thus the only one suited to draft the brief. Unfortunately, I am unable to complete it by June 6, due to a mass of pretrial filings that are due on June 3, June 7, and June 14 in another case on which I am lead counsel, *Silicon Genesis Corp. v. EV Group E. Thallner GmbH*, No. 3:22-cv-04986-JSC (N.D. Cal.).

Second, two days ago (on Memorial Day) we were advised by Mr. Hashim Mooppan of Jones Day that he intends to file an amicus brief in support of the petition on behalf of Retail Litigation Center. As that brief is also due on June 6, we request an extension so that our clients may have the opportunity to respond to any new or different arguments advanced in that brief.
