Dear Mr. Harris:

I represent respondent Michelle Casey in the above-captioned matter. On July 19, 2024, this Court directed respondent Casey, along with respondents Susan Haling, Chicago Housing Authority, Mark Lischka, Michael Moran, Board of Education of the City of Chicago, and Jonathan Maples, to file a response to the petition for a writ of *certiorari* by August 19, 2024. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, respondents respectfully request a 30-day extension of time, to September 18, 2024, to file their response.

Counsel for petitioner has authorized me to state that they do not oppose this request. And counsel for the other respondents have authorized me to state that they join in this request for an extension of time.

I request this extension because Assistant Attorney General Leigh J. Jahnig, who is assigned to draft the brief in opposition for respondent Casey under my supervision, requires additional time to draft that brief. Because the assistant attorney general who previously represented respondent Casey is no longer with our office, Ms. Jahnig assumed responsibility to draft the brief in opposition after the case was reassigned to her on July 23, 2024. Since then, Ms. Jahnig has had to familiarize herself with the factual and procedural background of the case, as well as the relevant legal issues before beginning to draft the response.
