**MOTION FOR LEAVE TO DISPENSE WITH
PREPARATION OF A JOINT APPENDIX**

Petitioner moves for leave to dispense with the requirement of a joint appendix in this case. *See* Sup. Ct. R. 26.8. The question presented is a pure question of law: whether the 60-day deadline of 5 U.S.C. § 7703(b)(1)(A) is jurisdictional. The appendix to the petition for a writ of certiorari already includes the relevant record. No other portion of the record merits such special attention to warrant the preparation and expense of a joint appendix. Nor would a separate joint appendix materially assist in the Court's consideration of this case. Respondent consents to this motion. For these reasons, the motion should be granted.
