
I represent Kim Jackson, respondent in the above-captioned case at this Court.

The petition for writ of certiorari in this case was filed on October 6, 2023, and docketed on October 11, 2023. On October 27, the Court extended the time to file respondent's brief in opposition for 30 days, to and including December 13, 2023. On December 4, 2023, the Court further extended the time for filing the brief in opposition to January 12, 2024.

Pursuant to Rules 15.3 and 30.4 of the rules of this Court, and with petitioner's consent, respondent respectfully requests a further 30-day extension of the time to file a brief in opposition, rendering it due on February 12, 2024. The extension is requested to enable undersigned counsel to prepare a brief in opposition that will best assist the Court in its consideration of the petition, due to the press of preexisting business both before the Court and elsewhere.

Counsel for respondent has conferred with counsel for petitioner regarding this motion, and the parties have consented to mutual extensions for the briefs in opposition in this case and in the case regarding respondent's conditional cross-petition (docketed at No. 23-514); the brief in opposition in that case is currently due on January 17, 2024. These mutual extensions will ensure that the petition and conditional cross-petition remain on a parallel schedule, enabling the Court to consider them together.
