Dear Mr. Harris:

I am Counsel of Record for the Respondent in the above-referenced matter. The petition for a writ of certiorari in this case was filed on November 3, 2023, and was placed on the docket on November 9, 2023. A brief in opposition is currently due on December 11, 2023.

Under Rule 30.4, the Respondent requests a 30-day extension, until January 10, 2024, to file a brief in opposition. The press of other litigation matters makes timely submission of a brief in opposition difficult absent an extension. In the near term, undersigned counsel is currently responsible for, among other things: (i) filing a brief in opposition in *White v. Kentucky*, No. 23-5549; (ii) giving an oral argument in *Cameron v. Beshear*, Nos. 2022-CA-0837, 2022-CA-0838 (Ky. App.); and (iii) filing an appellee brief in *Carr v. Holderfield*, No. 2023-CA-0401 (Ky. App.).

Petitioners consent to this request. The Court has already granted analogous extensions in other petitions for a writ of certiorari from the decision below. *L.W. v. Skrmetti*, No. 23-466; *United States v. Skrmetti*, 23-477.
