Dear Mr. Harris:

I am Counsel of Record for Respondent in the above-referenced matter. The petition for a writ of certiorari in this case was filed on November 3, 2023, and was placed on the docket on November 9, 2023. A brief in opposition is currently due on January 10, 2024.

Under Rule 30.4, Respondent requests an additional 26-day extension, until February 5, 2024, to file a brief in opposition. The press of other litigation matters makes timely submission of a brief in opposition difficult absent an extension, in part because one of the attorneys working on this matter recently accepted another position. In addition, undersigned counsel is currently responsible in the near term for filing: a merits brief in *Kentucky v. EPA*, No. 23-5343 (6th Cir.); an amicus brief in *Dunn v. Solomon Foundation*, Nos. 2023-SC-0235, 2023-SC-0236 (Ky.); and a reply brief in *Kentucky v. EPA*, No. 23-3216 (6th Cir.).

Petitioners consent to this request. The Court has already granted analogous second extensions in the other petitions for a writ of certiorari from the decision below. L.W. v. Skrmetti, No. 23-466; United States v. Skrmetti, 23-477.
