Dear Mr. Harris:

I am counsel for the respondents in this case. Petitioners filed their petition for a writ of certiorari on November 7, 2023. Respondents filed their response waiver on November 28, 2023. On December 28, 2023 the Court asked for a response which is presently due on January 29, 2024.

Pursuant to Rule 30.4, respondents respectfully request that the time for filing a response be extended by 30 days, to and including February 28, 2024.

This is respondents' first request for an extension of time to file a response.

Good cause exists for the requested extension. I am counsel in several matters before this Court in which filings were due in the last 6 weeks, including an emergency matter. Also, I have a merits brief due in a Fifth Circuit en banc case that is being handled on an expedited basis. Also, until yesterday I was preparing for a jury trial in the Southern District of Texas which has now been passed but nevertheless took up considerable time. I also have briefing due in a case before the District of South Carolina.
