Dear Mr. Harris:

I represent Cross-Respondents Chris Dutra, Jason Edmonson, and Eric Dejesus in the above-captioned case in this Court.

The conditional cross-petition for a writ of certiorari was filed on November 13, 2023 and, after docketing, Cross-Respondents' brief in opposition was due on December 18, 2023. On November 29, 2023, the Court extended the time to file Cross-Respondents' brief in opposition to January 17, 2024.

Pursuant to this Court's Rules 15.3 and 30.4, Cross-Respondents respectfully request an additional 30-day extension of time to file a brief in opposition, to and including February 16, 2024. The extension is necessary to allow the undersigned to prepare a brief in opposition in the manner most helpful to the Court given the intervening holidays and the press of professional commitments in other trial and appellate courts.
