PER CURIAM:

Laura Daines, appointed counsel for Wayne Lee Johnson, has moved to withdraw on appeal, supported by a brief prepared under *Anders v. California*, 386 U.S. 738 (1967). Johnson filed a response to his counsel's motion, requesting the appointment of new appellate counsel. Our independent review of the entire record reveals that counsel's assessment of the relative merit of the appeal is correct. Because independent examination of the entire record reveals no arguable issues of merit, counsel's motion to withdraw is **GRANTED**, and Johnson's convictions and sentences are **AFFIRMED**. Accordingly, Johnson's motion to appoint new counsel is **DENIED**.

**MEMORANDUM TO THE FCC COLEMAN MEDIUM INMATE POPULATION**

**FROM THE OFFICE OF THE CAPTAIN**

Subject: Institutional Lockdown

Due to an increase in narcotics activity resulting in serious medical emergencies involving the inmate population at FCC Coleman Medium, the institution has been placed on lockdown status. Visiting and programs are suspended until further notice. This measure has been taken to ensure the safety and well being of both inmates and staff. Periodic evaluations of the situation will be made by the administration to determine a safe time to resume normal operations.

As a reminder, there are several avenues to seek help for drug-related dependencies. A bulletin was released earlier this week providing further information and opportunities. You may also report concerns and information to the anonymous hotline number, which is posted throughout the housing areas.
