# 3.0 GOOD CAUSE: ADA Requested Reasonable Accommodation Time Extension (See Exhibit 2)

- 3.1 Under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) (Title 42 c. 126 U.S.C. §§ 12101) generally and under Title 42 U.S.C. § 12102, 12131, 12132, 12133 specifically and given Bostwick's Disabilities, Bostwick PROVIDES NOTICE ONLY and asks this Court for a "Reasonable Accommodation." The "Reasonable Accommodation" requested is for an "...Extension Of Time For Sixty (60) days from 11 July 2023 to and including Monday, 11 September 2023 (given Saturday 9 September) TO File Petition For Writ Of Certiorari..."
- 3.2 A partial list of Bostwick's past and future Disabilities are as follows:
- 3.2.1 In Exhibit 2, the Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH) Reports Verify Continuing and On-Going

Non-Functional Use and Swelling of his Left & Right Wrists, Hands and Fingers.

- 3.2.2 The May 15<sup>th</sup> 2023 Surgery of his Left Inguinal Hernia and Right Inguinal Hernia with embedded Appendix caused Bostwick to be unable to work on his Petition For Writ Of Certiorari.
- 3.2.3 Bostwick suffers from Massachusetts General Hospital Neurosurgeon and Rheumatologist Diagnosed Cervical (Neck) Spine Narrowing, Brachial Plexus and Thoracic Outlet Syndrome resulting in Non-Functional Use of Left & Right Wrists, Hands, Fingers with Possible Spine and Thoracic Surgery.
- 3.2.4 Bostwick Continues to Suffer from ADA Atrial Tachycardia Resulting in ADA Depression and Inability to Concentrate and Phobia (Fear) of another Stroke, Arrhythmia, Flutter and Tachycardia (24 Hours/ 7 Days) and a Possible Second Heart Surgery.
- 3.2.5 GIVEN Bostwick's Hernia Surgery, Heart Surgery, Heart Recovery (Arrhythmia, Flutter and Tachycardia), Brainstem Stroke, Non-Functional Left and Right Hands and Emotional Disabilities and associated Work Load concerning Bostwick's Multi-Family Residence Litigations, Bostwick has Difficulty

Concentrating, Reasoning, Reading, to include Emotional Distress, Depression and Anxiety.

- 3.3 The documents in Exhibit 2 provide the professional opinions concerning Bostwick's ADA physical and emotional health.
- 3.3.1 In Exhibit 2, the Dr. Huang, MGH Internal Medicine Associates documents Bostwick's ADA conditions with the following statement: "...multiple conditions, including anxiety, emotional distress, abdominal pain, palpitations, atrial fibrillation...swelling of both of his forearms, wrists, hands, and fingers, leading to further functional impairment...impaired his ability to concentrate and reason...inability to make...deadlines."
- 3.3.2 In Exhibit 2, MGH Dr. Hucker provides his MGH Cardiac Arrhythmia Service opinions concerning Bostwick's Heart and Court Deadlines.
- 3.3.3 In Exhibit 2, Dr. Kohler provides her MGH Rheumatology Musculoskeletal Service opinions about Bostwick's bilateral forearms, wrists, hands and fingers. PLEASE REFER TO Dr. Kohler's Report for PICTURES OF BOSTWICK'S DISABLED WRISTS, HANDS AND FINGERS.

- 3.3.4 In Exhibit 2, Dr. Berger provides documentation concerning Bostwick's Bilateral Inguinal Hernia with embedded Appendix Surgery on 15 May 2023.
- 3.3.5 In Exhibit 2, Dr. Williamson provides her MGH Neurosurgery opinions concerning Bostwick's Cervical Neck, referrals and relationship to Bostwick's forearm, wrists, hands and finger disabilities.
- 3.3.6 In Exhibit 2, MGH Eileen Collins provides detailed opinions about Bostwick's Disabilities to include being unable to lift a spoon of cereal for two weeks.
- 3.3.7 In Exhibit 2, Bostwick has an appointment with MGH Thoracic Surgeon, Dr. Donahue for Disabilities related to Thoracic Outlet Syndrome concerning a fused Rib and Collar Bone.
- 3.3.8 In Exhibit 2, Bostwick has an appointment with MGH Neuromuscular Service, Dr. Seyedsadjadi concerning Brachial Plexus Nerve compression.

#### MEMORANDUM AND ORDER PURSUANT TO RULE 23.0

The plaintiff appeals from a May 6, 2021, order of the Superior Court denying his April 30, 2021, motion to "vacate, modify and set aside" a March 2, 2011, judgment under Mass. R. Civ. P. 59 (e), 365 Mass. 827 (1974), and Mass. R. Civ. P. 60 (b), 365 Mass. 828 (1974). He claims that the judge erred in determining that he was time barred from bringing his motion, because the judge failed to consider the effect on the case of an automatic stay in bankruptcy.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> The plaintiff previously filed a motion to vacate the judgment on March 14, 2011, and the motion was denied by order entered on March 21, 2011. A notice of the motion at issue on appeal was filed on March 29, 2021 (pursuant to Rule 9E of the Superior Court [2020]), and after opposition was received, the Superior Court Rule 9A packet was filed on April 30, 2021.

The judge denied the defendant's motion because it sought to reopen a judgment that was more than ten years old. The plaintiff's motion under rule 59 (e) was required to be brought within ten days of the judgment. See Mass. R. Civ. P. 59 (e). See also Stephens v. Global NAPs, 70 Mass. App. Ct. 676, 682 (2007) (rule 59 [e] motions filed after ten-day deadline will be considered under rule 60 [b]). The defendant fared no better under rule 60 (b), which only allows a motion to be brought more than one year after judgment if the judgment is void, satisfied, or for some other reason not specified in Mass. R. Civ. P. 60 (b) (1) (excusable neglect), (2) (newly discovered evidence), or (3) (fraud). See Mass. R. Civ. P. 60 (b). See also Owens v. Mukendi, 448 Mass. 66, 71-72 (2006). Even then, the motion must be brought within a reasonable time. See Mass. R. Civ. P. 60 (b).

Here, the plaintiff's motion was premised on the theory that the March 2, 2011, judgment is void because, at the time it issued, there was an automatic stay of the proceedings due to a defendant, The Classic Group, Inc., having filed for bankruptcy. "The filing of a voluntary bankruptcy petition operates as an automatic stay of 'the commencement or continuation . . . of a judicial, administrative, or other action or proceeding against the debtor that was or could have been commenced before the commencement of the [bankruptcy] case.'" Beverly v. Bass River

Golf Mgt., Inc., 92 Mass. App. Ct. 595, 599 (2018), quoting 11 U.S.C. § 362(a)(1) (2012).

The Superior Court's March 2, 2011, judgment, however, did not commence or continue an action against a debtor in bankruptcy. Rather, the judgment terminated a suit against a debtor; thus, the automatic stay did not prohibit the court's action. See <a href="Maronte">Amonte</a>, 17 Mass. App. Ct. 621, 623-624 (1984) (purpose of automatic stay is to relieve debtors of collection proceedings which would nullify Bankruptcy Code's objective).

Additionally, since the plaintiff filed his motion more than ten years after a judgment of which he was aware, 3 it was well within the judge's discretion to determine that the motion was not filed within a reasonable time. See <a href="Owens">Owens</a>, 448 Mass. at

74-77 (three-year delay unreasonable where party was aware of facts giving rise to motion to vacate at time of judgment).

Order entered May 6, 2021, denying motion to vacate, affirmed.
