A response in this death penalty case is due October 20, 2023. Respondent respectfully requests a thirty-one-day extension of the present deadline, up to and including Monday, November 20, 2023. This is Respondent's first request for an extension in this case. The extension request is not sought for an improper purpose, including harassment or unnecessary delay. Rather, counsel requires additional time because he was not counsel for Respondent in the court below. Consequently, counsel has been unable to complete his review of the relevant records and prepare a response.
