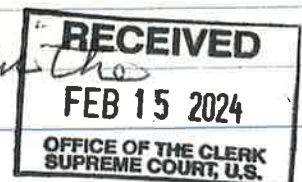

Lawrence T. Curtis v United States

Rule 14(a) "The question presented for review expressed concisely in relation to the circumstances of the case without unnecessary detail."

A. The question for review:

- 1 Do I have a 5th amendment right to freedom of Religion?
- 2 Do I have a 6th amendment right to have all the elements of the alleged crime presented to the Grand Jury?
- 3 Do I have a 6th amendment right to have all the elements of the alleged crime in the Charging Document?



B. The Court denied my petition for writ of Certiorari (without giving any reasons).

The ground which is limited to intervening circumstances between my request for review and the denial of my petition for writ of certiorari is my request for rehearing.
