I am counsel for the respondent in this case. Petitioner filed his petition for writ of certiorari on or about November 30, 2023. Respondent filed her waiver of right to respond on December 14, 2023. On December 26, 2023, the Court issued a request for response with a due date of January 25, 2024. Pursuant to Rule 30.4, respondent respectfully requests that the time for filing a response be extended by 30 days, to and including February 26, 2024.<sup>1</sup>

This is respondent's first request for an extension of time to file the response. Good cause exists for the requested extension.
