

I, Alfred C. Dizon: "do declare (certify, verify, or state) under penalty of perjury, and under the laws of the United States of America that the foregoing and following are true and correct".

I am a Veteran, with a Service-Connected-Disability, and this affidavit prepared is required by Rule 40(1) of the Supreme Court of the United States.

Date of Service entry June 3, 1981, I have served continuously until February 28, 2006, served for 24 -plus years, receiving an Honorable Discharge for faithful and honorable service to my country. Attached is a certified, notarized with raised stamp seal copy of my DD-214, provided by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, furnished by the Wichita County Court, Wichita Falls, Texas.

Thereafter, on December 16, 2020, I initiated this suit in the United States Northern District Court of Wichita Falls, Texas, under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964.

I now wish to file a petition for certiorari, as a veteran, seeking review of these judgment/s to be “*fully informed*”, and in addition, respectfully request this Higher Court to hear and adjudicate my case (if possible), or This High Court to remand Lower Court to take action and summon Defendant, to appear and answer and, upon trial, enter judgment against Defendant’s wrongdoings. In order for Appellant/Petitioner to present, prove, and defend his case (in an open court/hearing) against Defendant’s wrongdoings (of false accusations and unsupported allegations) and also the use of “*pretext*” in illegally and unlawfully terminating appellant/petitioner). In order for the truth to be revealed, for justice to prevail, and atonement/compensation allowed by law be granted, along with such other and further relief which Petitioner may show himself to be lawfully entitled, by law or in equity. In Conclusion, So that “due process of law” may be provided Petitioner, rectifying and satisfying violation of Appellant’s/Petitioner’s Constitutional Rights (of a “*fair and impartial jury trial*” as initially requested/paid by Litigant). And also rectify/remedy Judge’s “*Abuse of Discretion*” by not allowing proffered exhibits to be presented (by Appellant) in an actual court setting or hearing, which was also initially requested by Petitioner, as outlined on the:

**“Bill of Rights, 1st Amendment”**

“Congress shall make no law prohibiting the free exercise thereof, or *abridging* the freedom to exercise or petition the government for a redress of grievances”.

My Opinion:

“A party is denied Fair Trial, when they are denied Due Process of Law” -A Dizon

“Abuse of Discretion/Power” - is by one not allowing/admitting Litigant to present his/her proffered exhibits or evidence/s (of “*clear and convincing evidence*”) in an Actual Court Hearing or Setting, Thus eliminating/disregarding “Preponderance of Evidence/s” which is a critical and important factor in adjudicating one’s case, or in defending one’s cause /case.


