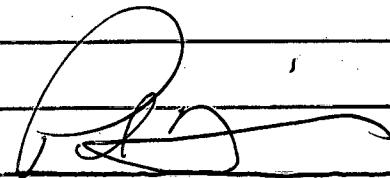
Criminal Justice Act, 18 U.S.C. § 3006A. United States v. Hansmeier, No.

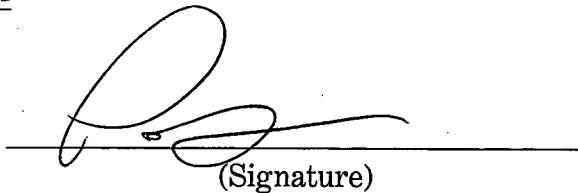
