

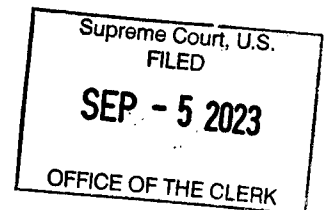


MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE *IN FORMA PAUPERIS*

The Petitioner asks leave to file previously filed appeal without prepayment of costs and to proceed *in forma pauperis*.

Petitioner has previously been granted leave to file in *forma pauperis* in most of the previous courts he has had filings in except in relation to the immediate filing and one other. Petitioner exhausted his finances in the paying of the \$120.⁰⁰ District Court filing fee, \$140.⁰⁰ Wyoming Supreme Court filing fee, and the \$100.⁰⁰ District Court File Preparation Fee in this case and the other case being presented at the same time. Petitioner only expects to be paid approximately \$45.⁰⁰ each month to provide for his hypoglycemic snacks, over the counter medicines, printing needs, postage needs and all other needs. Petitioner's affidavit or declaration in support of this motion is attached hereto.

Note: Prison's records show the "Mandatory Savings" that is deducted from inmates' incomes as part of their balances when in fact, the inmates have no access to those funds until they are released from prison, not even to pay the courts.

Therefore, those funds cannot be counted in relation to determining forma pauperis status as the inmate cannot retrieve them for payment purposes unless the Court orders the Wyoming Department of Corrections to use those funds for payment of Court fees.
