STATEMENT OF THE CASE

I was sentenced to 150 years to life for a spree of 8 banks unarmed robberies from 10-5-17 to ten twenty seven, two thousand seventeen. I lost at trial but was given the 5-year enhancement law making my new sentence 125 years to life on appeal. I was denied Penal Code § 1385(B). I was granted "the mental health diversion" for relief in 2024 March. I am requesting the relief under Racial Justice Act (R.J.A.) came into effect Jan. 1, 2024. This ~~petition~~ is requested under "extraordinary writ of habeas corpus." Also I filed the Batson v. Wheeler motion that was also denied on ~~appeal~~ appeal

REASONS FOR GRANTING THE PETITION

The district court has no jurisdiction to grant a new trial under the circumstances of this case. Plaintiff has exhausted all state remedies. Also requesting "Racial Justice Act" for relief. My First, Fourth, and Eighth Amendment rights have been violated as well deliberate indifference. I was not treated fairly during my trial nor my African American juror during voir dire. These are reasons my petition should be granted. I also filed a motion to have my resentencing heard by a different Judge other than my trial judge who clearly held bias opinions and judgement during my trial and case. Laws have been passed for cases like mine but in the district court I am being treated unfairly and with bias judgment, because of my case and ethnicity. Please hear and grant my petition.
