Petitioner, pro se, appeals the denial of post-conviction relief by the District Court of Washington County in Case Nos. CF-1998-80, CF-1998-81, and CF-1998-83. Before the District Court, Petitioner asserted that the State lacked jurisdiction to convict and punish him. *See McGirt v. Oklahoma*, 140 S.Ct. 2452 (2020). In *State ex rel. Matloff v. Wallace*, 2021 OK CR 21, 497 P.3d 686, *cert. denied*, 142 S.Ct. 757 (2022), this Court determined that the United States Supreme Court decision in *McGirt*, because it is a new procedural rule, is not retroactive and does not void final state convictions. *See Matloff*, 2021 OK CR 21, ¶¶ 27-28, 40, 497 P.3d at 691-92, 694.


The convictions in this matter were final before the July 9, 2020, decision in *McGirt*, and the United States Supreme Court's holding in *McGirt* does not apply. We decline Petitioner's invitation to revisit our holding in *Matloff*.

The District Court's order denying post-conviction relief in Washington County District Court Case Nos. CF-1998-80, CF-1998-81, and CF-1998-83 is **AFFIRMED**. Pursuant to Rule 3.15, *Rules of the Oklahoma Court of Criminal Appeals*, Title 22, Ch.18, App. (2023), the **MANDATE** is **ORDERED** issued upon the delivery and filing of this decision. Petitioner is placed on notice that his state remedies are deemed exhausted on all issues raised in his petition in error, brief, and any prior appeals. See Rule 5.5, *supra*.


