



STRIKING MOTIONS FILED PRO SE

Defendant filed several motions on his own behalf while represented by court-appointed appellate counsel. There is no constitutional right to hybrid representation. *People v Dennany*, 445 Mich 412, 442 (1994). Indeed, "a defendant must choose between his right to court-appointed counsel and his right to conduct his own defense." *People v Ramsey*, 89 Mich App 260, 264 (1979).

Accordingly, this Court declines to entertain motions filed by Defendant on his own behalf when he has counsel to take such actions for him. If appellate counsel believes these motions are consistent with Defendant's objectives and supported by the law and facts, then counsel can frame those issues for the Court's consideration.



THE COURT THEREFORE STRIKES Defendant's pro se Motion for Disqualification-Recusal, Motion to Withdraw Plea, and Motion for Evidentiary Hearing.
