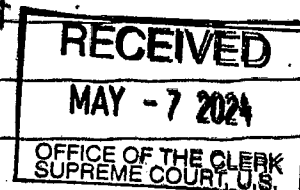

Because Plaintiff James L. Miller ("Plaintiff") has requested leave to proceed in forma pauperis in this action ("IFP Request"), the Court has screened the Complaint to determine whether the action is frivolous or malicious, fails to state a claim on which relief may be granted, or seeks monetary relief against a defendant who is immune from such relief. See 28 U.S.C. § 1915(e)(2).

Plaintiff names as the only defendant to this action Scott S. Harris, Clerk of the Supreme Court of the United States, both in his individual and official capacities. In the Complaint, Plaintiff seeks damages and declaratory relief for the perceived mishandling of his matters before the United States Supreme Court.

Judges and judicial officials, such as court clerks, performing quasi-judicial functions are entitled to absolute immunity "from civil liability for damages for their judicial acts." *Mullins v. U.S. Bankruptcy Court for Dist. of Nev.*, 828 F.2d 1385, 1388 (9th Cir. 1987); see also *Sharma v. Stevas*, 790 F.2d 1486, 1486 (9th Cir. 1986) ("The defendant Clerk of the United States Supreme Court has absolute quasi-judicial immunity because his challenged activities were an integral part of the judicial process."); *Demoran v. Witt*, 781 F.2d 155, 156 (9th Cir. 1985) ("courts have extended absolute judicial immunity from damage actions under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 not only to judges but also to officers whose functions bear a close association to the judicial process"). "The judicial or quasi-judicial immunity available to federal officers is not limited to immunity from damages, but extends to actions for declaratory, injunctive and other equitable relief." *Moore v. Brewster*, 96 F.3d 1240, 1243-44 (9th Cir. 1996), superseded by statute on other grounds (quoting *Mullis v. Bankruptcy Court for the District of Nevada*, 828 F.2d 1385, 1394 (9th Cir. 1987)); *Atkinson-Baker & Assoc. v. Kolts*, 7 F.3d 1452, 1454 (9th Cir. 1993) (per curiam) ("Federal judges are absolutely immune from claims for declaratory and injunctive relief arising from their judicial acts."). Judicial immunity applies "however erroneous the act may have been, and however injurious in its consequences it may have proved to the plaintiff." *Moore*, 96 F.3d at 1244.

No amendment can save this Complaint, so it will be dismissed without leave to amend.
