ORDER APPOINTING COUNSEL ON APPEAL

The Defendant was convicted of capital murder after a jury trial. The Court sentenced the Defendant to death in accordance with the Jury's answers to the special issues submitted on February 27, 2020. The Court finds that the Defendant is indigent. The Defendant has requested that Douglas H. Parks, who served as third-chair trial counsel, be appointed to represent him on appeal. Mr. Parks has also requested that he be appointed to represent the Defendant on appeal. According to Article 26.052(j)-(k) of the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, the Court finds that good cause exists and appoints **Douglas H. Parks** to represent the Defendant for the purposes of his automatic appeal of his conviction and sentence to the Court of Criminal Appeals.
