ORDER

AND NOW, this 4th day of December 2023, upon considering the Oregon Plaintiff's Application to proceed without paying fees or costs (ECF No. 1) and screening his handwritten *pro se* Complaint (ECF No. 2) apparently seeking to sue the Supreme Court, the United States Marshals, and Congress for undecipherable political questions seemingly related to the national debt and some unidentifiable investigation, finding Plaintiff qualifies to proceed without paying the filing fees but, upon our Congressionally-mandated screening consistent with section 1915 confirming the immunity of the named parties and otherwise unable to offer redress to political questions, we cannot permit this Complaint (ECF No. 2) by an Oregon citizen against immune actors relative to political questions to proceed in federal court, but mindful of his *pro se* status, it is ORDERED we :GRANT Plaintiff's Motion to proceed *in forma pauperis* (ECF No. 1) but DISMISS the Complaint (ECF No. 2) without prejudice as Plaintiff has not alleged a claim against these parties challenging political questions or otherwise indecipherable allegations unrelated to a case or controversy but grant Plaintiff leave to file an amended Complaint consistent with Rule 8 by no later than December 27, 2023 or we will close the case.
