**In Re: Application for Exemption from
Electronic Public Access Fees by
Carolyn Green**

This matter is before the Court upon the application and request by Ms. Carolyn Green for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts.

The Court finds that Ms. Green, as a homeless and possibly indigent litigant in the process of filing for bankruptcy, falls within the class of users listed in the fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption. Additionally, Ms. Green has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information. Accordingly, Ms. Green shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this court, specifically for case number 2:21-cv-01276-RAJ, in which she is the plaintiff.

1 She shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with
2 other uses of the PACER system in this court. Additionally, the following limitations
3 apply:

- 4 1. this fee exemption applies only to Ms. Carolyn Green and is valid only for the
5 purposes stated above;
- 6 2. this fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this court that are
7 available through the PACER system;
- 8 3. by accepting this exemption, Ms. Green agrees not to sell for profit any data
9 obtained as a result of receiving this exemption;
- 10 4. Ms. Green is prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of
11 receiving this exemption, including redistribution via internet-based databases;
- 12 5. this exemption is valid retroactively to April 1, 2022 until September 30, 2023.

12 This exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time. A copy of this

Notice of Potential Dismissal

If the Debtor(s) fails to appear at the meeting of creditors, the U.S. Trustee may apply for an order of dismissal without further notice.




