Dear Mr. Harris:

The petition for a writ of certiorari in the above-captioned case was filed on January 5, 2024. Responses to the petition are now due, after two extensions, on April 3, 2024. We respectfully request, under Rule 30.4 of the Rules of this Court, a further extension of time to and including May 3, 2024, for all respondents to file responses.

This extension is necessary because the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit has granted rehearing en banc in a parallel case, <u>Consumers' Research</u> v. <u>FCC</u>, No. 22-60008 (argued Sept. 19, 2023). The Fifth Circuit's decision could affect the resolution of the petition for a writ of certiorari in this case.

Counsel for petitioners and for intervenor-respondents consent to this further extension.
