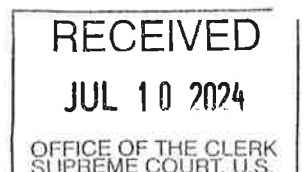
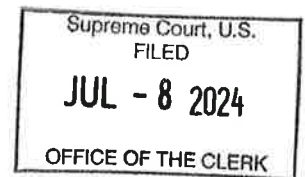

Motion to Expedite Consideration of Civil Case Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1657(a) in compliance
with Rule 21. Motions to the Court



Issue 1 : Expedite Consideration of Civil Case

May I please the court Now appearing before the court, I, Nickholas Knight Sr, the petitioner in the aforementioned case, hereby submit this motion to request the expedited consideration of this civil case in accordance with 28 U.S.C. § 1657(a). It is worth noting, in adherence to Rule 21 of the Supreme Court Rules and Procedures, that motions in actions falling within the Court's original jurisdiction must comply with the requirements outlined in Rule 17.3.

As outlined in the aforementioned provision, courts are given the discretion to determine the order in which civil cases should be considered.

In the present case, conference was set on 09/30/2024 it is imperative that the court expedite the consideration of this civil case due to the significant harm and prejudice that may result from any delay, and grant petitioner Writ of Certiorari. The plaintiff, Nickholas Knight Sr has presented compelling evidence supporting his claim for temporary or preliminary injunctive relief. Delaying the resolution of this matter could cause irreparable harm to the plaintiff, as it involves an urgent situation that requires immediate action. Additionally, legal precedents in similar cases have consistently recognized the importance of expediting cases that involve the potential deprivation of fundamental rights or the preservation of public interest. The failure to grant expedited consideration in this instance may impede the plaintiff's ability to assert and protect his legal rights effectively. Therefore, the expedited consideration of this case is necessary to prevent any further harm, preserve the integrity of the legal process, and ensure justice is served in an efficient and timely manner. Nickholas Knight Sr also alleges a violation of his rights, including human rights violations without a fair trial, the misuse of government power, and coercion and manipulation by the respondents. The petitioner requests that the Supreme Court of the United States grant certiorari based on an unprecedented unconstitutional statutory case and intervene in the matter by granting an oral argument and/or reversing and remanding the lower court's decision. The petitioner has identified several statutes that they argue have been violated. relief sought is from the judgment of a state court, the petition shall set out specifically how and where the petitioner has exhausted available remedies in the state courts or otherwise comes within the provisions of 28 U. S. C. § 2254(b)



Based on the foregoing, I respectfully request that this Honorable Court exercise its discretion under 28 U.S.C. § 1657(a) to expedite the consideration of this case and grant temporary injunctive relief. I defer to this court to determine the appropriate relief in this matter.

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


