 \underline{ORDER}

Before: BOGGS, KETHLEDGE, and DAVIS, Circuit Judges.

Darryl Smith, an Ohio prisoner, petitions for a writ of mandamus and asks that we compel the district court to file and process his civil-rights action and randomly reassign it to a different district court judge. Smith also twice moves to proceed *in forma pauperis*.

Mandamus "is a drastic and extraordinary remedy reserved for really extraordinary causes." *Cheney v. U.S. Dist. Ct. for Dist. of Columbia*, 542 U.S. 367, 380 (2004) (internal quotation marks and citation omitted). "[T]hree conditions must be satisfied before it may issue." *Id.* First, the petitioner must have no other adequate remedy to obtain the relief he seeks. *Id.* Second, the right to the writ must be "clear and indisputable." *Id.* at 381 (citation omitted). Finally, even if these prerequisites have been met, issuance of the writ must be "appropriate under the circumstances." *Id.*

Smith had an adequate alternative remedy to request the relief he seeks in his mandamus petition. He pursued this remedy by moving the district court for leave to file his complaint. That his motion was denied does not render that remedy inadequate. He also could have appealed the denial of his motion for leave but failed to do so. Because Smith failed to pursue his available adequate remedies, he cannot demonstrate that he has a clear and indisputable right to mandamus relief or that issuance of the writ is appropriate.

The petition for a writ of mandamus is **DENIED**, and the motions to proceed in forma

pauperis are DENIED AS MOOT.
