MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO FILE PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI AND REQUEST FOR PRO SE FILING PACKET

By around September 5, 2023, Andres Cabezas's petition for writ of certiorari must be filed for the above 11th Circuit case in order to be reviewed by this Court. Because Cabezas is filing as a pro prisoner, he requests an enlargement of time of 60 days to file his petition.

Cabezas's incarceration results in many difficulties in filing in Court, including access to resources and mundane amenities such as the mail. Cabezas has asked his family for, among other things, a Supreme Court pro se certiorari packet and several briefs to assist him in filing his petition for certiorari. It has been over a month, and neither has arrived because the prison mail system has been exceedingly slow.

The reason for the slow mail has not been explained by prison staff. It is likely a heightened incoming mail inspection criteria, as official mail (i.e. from the government and courts) seems to be mostly unaffected. Cabezas thus respectfully requests this Court's Clerk to furnish him with a pro se certiorari package.

Cabezas respectfully requests an additional 60 days to file his petition.
