Application for Extension of Time to File
A Petition for Writ of Certiorari

Comes now the petitioner, Quaysean Williams, and respectfully moves this Court, pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 22, to grant him a sixty (60) day extension of time, from and after November 3, 2023, on until January 3, 2024, within which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in the above-entitled cause, and states:

1. That petitioner's petition for a writ of certiorari is currently due on or before November 3, 2023. See attached copy of Summary Opinion.

2. That petitioner is unable to file the petition for a writ of certiorari within the designated time period because;

a. Petitioner is a prisoner proceeding in this cause pro se;

b. The prison limits the hours within which petitioner may have access to the prison law library and the legal material contained there are very limited;

c. That the issues presented in this case are complex;

d. That petitioner has a limited knowledge of the law;

Therefore, an additional amount of time will be necessary for petitioner to prepare a proper petition for a writ of certiorari;


3. The respondent's counsel, the Attorney General of Oklahoma, has not been contacted regarding this extension request;

4. The respondent will not be prejudiced by the extension, as no deadline is scheduled and no deadline will be impacted;

Wherefore, petitioner respectfully requests this Court to grant him a sixty (60) day extension of time, from and after November

3, 2023, or until January 3, 2024, within
which to file a petition for writ of certiorari
in this case.
