

PARTIES TO THE PROCEEDING AND RULE 29.6 STATEMENT

All parties appear in the caption of the case on the cover page. A list of all parties to the proceeding in the Court whose judgment is the subject of this petition is as follows:

- 1. John-Henry Ayanbadejo, Plaintiff-Petitioner.
- 2. Chanel Goosby
- 3. Allstate Fire & Casualty Insurance Company, Defendant-Respondent.

The Petitioner, John-Henry Ayanbadejo is not a Corporation; therefore, a corporate disclosure statement is not required under Supreme Court Rule 29.6.

TO THE HONORABLE JUSTICE SAMUEL ALITO OF THE UNITED STATES SUPREME COURT:

Pursuant to this Court's Rules 13.5, 22, 30.2, and 30.3, Petitioner John-Henry Ayanbadejo respectfully requests that the time to file his Petition for Writ of Certiorari in this matter be extended for 60 days up to and including March 25, 2024. In support of this Application, Petitioner shows the following:

- 1. The Supreme Court of Texas in [Austin, Texas] rendered its judgment denying the Petitioner's, John-Henry Ayanbadejo's, Petition for Review in [John-Henry Ayanbadejo, Appellant v. Chanel Goosby and Allstate Fire & Casualty Insurance Company], No. [23-0343], on [August 4, 2023] and denied Motion for Rehearing of the said Petition for Review on [October 20, 2023]. See, App. 1, 2, and App. 3. The Petition for Writ of Certiorari is due no later than [January 22, 2024].
- 2. Petitioner requests an extension of time of sixty (60) working days, to [March 25, 2024]. This is Petitioner's first request for an extension of time in regards to this Application at this Court in this case.
- 3. Petitioner relies on the following facts as a reasonable explanation for the requested extension of time. John-Henry Ayanbadejo is *Pro se* Petitioner, in this case, as a proximate result of the criminal interference of his Civil, Statutory, and Constitutional Rights to hire an attorney of his choice in a civil hearing. Ayanbadejo, in addition to preparing a Petition for Writ of Certiorari in this case, must also devote time to the following additional matters: [Petitioner's health]. Petitioner, John-Henry Ayanbadejo, travelled overseas to take care of his

elderly parents and to continue with treatment that Petitioner sought overseas as a proximate result of Respondent's refusal to pay for injuries sustained in an accident on Petitioner's way to Dallas, Texas for work. On returning on November 6, 2023, Petitioner developed a chest infection that affected him for approximately 2 months compounded by the side effects of the medication prescribed by his overseas doctors. During such time, Petitioner could not work on his said Petition for Writ of Certiorari to this Court from a decision of the Supreme Court of Texas as well as work on his regular job to pay his basic necessities.

Pro se Petitioner's said Petition for a Writ of Certiorari to this Court raises the following very important issues that requires Pro se Petitioner to conduct more research and analysis to prepare for a Petition for Writ of Certiorari before this Court:

- 1. United States Constitutional due process and equal protection issues under the First, Fourth, Fifth, Seventh, and Fourteenth Amendment.
- 2. The said Petition raises Federal Questions regarding the case citing Supreme Court Judicial precedent.
- 3. The said Petition raises important consumer related issues and the rights of consumers to file suit against insurance companies that are in fiduciary relationships with consumers in the State of Texas.
- 4. It is important to note that as opposed to Respondents who have multiple attorneys representing them, Petitioner was forced to continue this case *pro se* as a proximate result of the egregious actions of his former attorney, his employees, and other possible parties that deprived *pro se* Petitioner

from hiring other Texas Licensed Attorneys from continuing the case on behalf of Petitioner as this Court will plainly see from the Petition for Writ of Certiorari.

5. During the pendency of this case a reasonable effort was made to resolve the dispute at the 14th Court of Appeals of Texas without the necessity of Court intervention, and the effort failed due mainly to Respondents' and the said former attorney's failures. Therefore, Petitioner prays that this Court grant this motion for extension of time for an additional 60 days or till March 25, 2024. See, App. 1.
