Petitioner is filing a pro se petition for a writ of certiorari in the Supreme Court of the United States.

The Supreme Court of California declined review of the case thus exhausting state remedies on November 29 of 2023.

The Supreme Court of the United States has jurisdiction to review a decision of the State's courts under the authority of the 28 U.S.C.S. §1257(a) "Final judgments or decrees rendered by the highest court of a state in which a decision could be had, may be reviewed by the Supreme Court by writ of certiorari...?"

The United States Supreme Court's Rules expressly provide for extensions of time in which to file a petition for a writ of certiorari, [Sup. Ct. R 13.5] for good cause, a justice may extend the time to file a petition for a writ of certiorari for a period not exceeding 60 days.

Petitioner is a benighted layman attempting to file a pro se petition for a writ of certiorari.

On December 5, 2023 at 7PM petitioner received the attached decision of November 29, 2023 denying Petition for Review from the Supreme Court of California.

On December 18, 2023 petitioner received the attached letter from the attorney appointed by the State dated December 8 of 2023 and stamped received by Corcoran State Prison on Dec. 15, 2023.

On December 19, 2023 petitioner received a document dump of court records exceeding 2,000 pages of evidence to be reviewed by petitioner before he is able to attempt to file a petition for writ of certiorari in the United States Supreme Court seeking review of a verdict that is clearly contrary to the conjoined, undisputed facts presented to the court in State court proceedings.
