PROCEED ON PAPERS PREPARED AS REQUIRED BY RULE 33.2

“Purpose and sense of Congress” as stated in 38 U.S.C. ¶ 4301(b) *“it is the sense of Congress that the Federal Government should be a model employer in carrying out the provisions of this chapter.”*

William B. Jolley is a veteran of military service as a member of the United States Air Force from 3 March 1950 to 14 December 1959. He holds two Honorable discharges and is rated as a hundred percent disabled by the Veterans Administration due to injuries resulting from the conditions of military service. Mr. Jolley's service included the Korean conflict where he spent about a year in the combat country at the airbase at Kunsan, Korea. His service also includes approximately four years as a Special Agent for the Air Force Office of Special Investigations.
