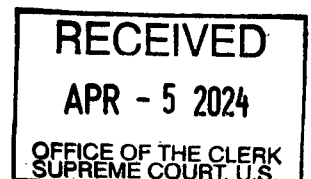

MOTION TO FILE PETITION FOR WRIT OF CERTIORARI OUT OF TIME

The Petitioner, Joseph R. Mayo, a DC inmate incarcerated at FCI Victorville II, in Adelanto, California, comes before this Honorable Court to file his Petition for Writ of Certiorari Out of Time as directed by the Clerk of the Supreme Court of the United States in their letter dated March 20, 2024. See Exhibit A

The Petitioner received the Petition for a Writ of Certiorari (Application 23A594 (75 Pages), dated March 6, 2024, that was returned, by the Office of the Clerk of the Supreme Court of the United States, on March 26, 2024.



The Petitioner is following the directions of the Clerk of Court and resubmitting his Petition via a/this Motion to File Petition Out of Time. The Petitioner's financial status was/is a critical point in this case and directly impacted - and CONTINUES to IMPACT - the Petitioner's ability to be able to mail (a) request(s) for an extension of time to file his case documents. See "Reasons for Granting Petition" Section 2.(a)(2) Page 29 of 39 (RE: Mays v. United States NDWV 5:22-cv-36 Doc. 16 Page 2 P3 ("plaintiff's low account balance.")). THAT was why the Petitioner called the Office of the Clerk DIRECTLY, but was unable to get through on the institution (FCI Victorville II) phone. The Petitioner had to ask his sister to call for him because he ONLY had enough stamps, which he obtained from the kindness of others (i.e. God). See Exhibits D, H. However, on the 12th of February, as the Petitioner was talking to his sister, the institution went on lockdown from February 12, 2024 to February 26, 2024, further hindering/delaying the Petitioner's completion of his Writ of Certiorari (Application 23A594). See Exhibits D, E, F, G, and H(1).

The Petitioner was finally able to copy the documentation on

February 26, 2024 - the majority of it - and completed and sent it out on March 6, 2024. See Exhibit E. The Petitioner was not able to obtain proof, from FBoE staff, of the lockdown, until March 26, 2024, which was AFTER the Petitioner had sent the Petition out. The Petitioner sent that documentation with the Petitioner's other Writ of Certiorari (Petition for); Application 23A421. See Exhibits E and F and H(3).

The Petitioner, respectfully, requests that this Honorable Court GRANT a review of this case/Petition to provide the Petitioner with EQUAL ACCESS to JUSTICE. He SHOULD NOT be deprived of an opportunity to have his case/Petition heard because of his Defendant-induced poverty. In other words, if it were not for the interference of employees of the Defendant at USP Lampoc, CA, in July 2022, when they failed to provide the Petitioner with the Defendant's Answer, but gave him the Roseboro Notice, his case may not have been dismissed due to a lack of funds to respond to TWO COURT CASES (2:22-cv-05524-SVW-PVC, Mays v. Birkholz 9th Cir. 2022; and 5:22-cv-36 NDWV Mays v. United States


(4th Cir. 2022)) AT THE SAME TIME, but stamps for ONLY ONE. See

Presidential Memorandum of May 18, 2021, 86 Fed. Reg. 27793:

(... By the authority vested in me as President by the Constitution and the laws of the United States of America, and in order to increase meaningful access to our legal system and an array of Federal programs, it is hereby ordered as follows: "Section 1. Policy. This Nation was founded on the ideal of equal justice law. Everyone in this country should be able to vindicate their rights and avail themselves of the protections that our laws afford on equal footing. ... " But there is much more for the Federal Government to do. According to a 2017 study by the Legal Services Corporation, low-income Americans receive inadequate or no professional legal assistance with regard to over 80 percent of the civil legal problems they face in a given year. All too often, [as in the Petitioner's case], UNADDRESSED LEGAL ISSUES push PEOPLE into POVERTY. ... "Sec. 2. The Department of Justice's Access-to-Justice Function. (a) ... The DOJ has a critical role to play in improving the justice delivery systems that serve PEOPLE who CANNOT AFFORD lawyers, [and I am committed to reinvigorating that work.].)

Therefore, for the foregoing reasons, this Motion to File My Petition for Writ of Certiorari Out of Time, for circumstances beyond the Petitioner's control and due to his poverty, should be GRANTED for: 1) the FAIR administration of justice; 2) the public's RIGHT to KNOW what their government is up to, including the inhumane treatment of prisoners and similarly situated petitioners (deprived of access to justice due to poverty); and 3) to PREVENT a gross miscarriage of justice.

I, Joseph R. Mays, declare, under 28 USC § 1746, that the foregoing is true and correct under penalty of perjury under the law of the United States of America. Executed on March 28, 2024.




