## MOTION TO DISPENSE WITH THE REQUIREMENT OF A JOINT APPENDIX

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## MOTION

The petition for a writ of certiorari in this case was filed on April 3, 2025, and granted on June 30, 2025. Pursuant to this Court's Rule 26.8, petitioner Isabel Rico respectfully moves to dispense with the requirement of a joint appendix. Counsel for petitioner has conferred with the Solicitor General, who has authorized petitioner to state that the United States concurs that a joint appendix is unnecessary in this case.

This case concerns the application of the "fugitive tolling" doctrine to the context of federal supervised release, a primarily legal question that does not turn in significant respect on any details of the proceedings in petitioner's specific case. The appendix included with the petition for a writ of certiorari includes the relevant decisions and orders from the lower courts, as well as the transcript of the relevant sentencing hearing. The parties do not believe that any other portion of the record merits special attention or would materially assist in this Court's consideration of the case. Accordingly, the parties agree that the burden and expense of preparing a joint appendix are not warranted under the circumstances.

For the foregoing reasons, the motion to dispense with the requirement of a joint appendix should be granted.
