

**CERTIFICATION OF GOOD FAITH AND NOT
FOR PURPOSE OF DELAY
(No. 24-411, U.S. Supreme Court)**

This Court's recent decision in *Williams v. Reed*, which establishes that the *Civil Rights Act of 1871, 42 U.S.C. Section 1983* is preemptive of exhaustion of remedies requirements in civil rights cases in both state court and federal court, is a substantial intervening circumstance.

Because it is clear that any civil rights case brought by Petitioner raising due process of the law issues in this disbarment would be defended by the State Bar of Nevada and routinely dismissed by the Supreme Court of Nevada on collateral estoppel, res judicata and Full Faith and Credit of the Law grounds, this court must intervene in this petition to establish that a minimum national standard of due process of the laws in attorney discipline cases and reciprocal disbarment cases preempts the collateral estoppel and res judicata and Full Faith and Credit grounds for the reciprocal disbarment of the Supreme Court of Nevada (and also in California federal court with reference to the prior petitions in this court challenging these California rulings).

This petition for rehearing is submitted for filing in good faith and without purpose to delay the reciprocal disbarment.
