ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL

Petitioner did not file the Notice of Intent to Appeal and Designation of Record in the District Court within ten (10) days of the date the judgment and sentence was imposed as required by this Court's Rule 2.5(A), *Rules of the Oklahoma Court of Criminal Appeals*, Title 22, Ch.18, App. (2024). Filing of the Notice of Intent to Appeal and Designation of Record is jurisdictional, and failure to timely file constitutes waiver of the right to appeal. Petitioner's appeal is **DISMISSED**. If Petitioner feels she has been denied an appeal through no fault of her own, she may seek the appropriate relief with the District Court. See Rule 2.1(E)(1), *Rules of the Oklahoma Court of Criminal Appeals*, Title 22, Ch.18, App. (2024). Issuance of this order concludes proceedings before this Court.

See Rule 10.1(C)(2), *Rules of the Oklahoma Court of Criminal Appeals*, Title 22, Ch.18, App. (2024). Petitioner's pleading requesting extraordinary relief does not contain a copy of a trial court order or records sufficient to prove he was denied relief in the District Court. The Court **DECLINES** jurisdiction and **DISMISSES** this matter.
