



**MEMORANDUM OPINION**

This is an attempted appeal from an order signed January 3, 2023. No post-judgment motion was filed. Appellant's notice of appeal was filed June 12, 2023. The notice of appeal must be filed within 30 days after the judgment is signed when appellant has not filed a timely post-judgment motion. *See Tex. R. App. P. 26.1.*


Appellant's notice of appeal was not filed timely. A motion to extend time is necessarily implied when an appellant, acting in good faith, files a notice of appeal beyond the time allowed by Texas Rule of Appellate Procedure 26.1, but within the 15-day grace period provided by Rule 26.3 for filing a motion to extend time. *See Verburgt v. Dorner*, 959 S.W.2d 615, 617–18 (1997) (construing the predecessor to Rule 26). Appellant's notice of appeal was not filed within the 15-day period provided by Texas Rule of Appellate Procedure 26.3.

On July 20, 2023, notification was transmitted to all parties that the appeal was subject to dismissal without further notice for want of jurisdiction. *See Tex. R. App. P. 42.3(a)*. Appellant's response fails to demonstrate that this court has jurisdiction to entertain the appeal.

Accordingly, the appeal is ordered dismissed.

The County Attorney served Petitioner with another order which was completely changed and signed by Surendran Patel on January 10<sup>th</sup> and O'Neil Williams on January 12<sup>th</sup> of 2023.

Finally, the Index of the court has been changed and amended its fillings, showing the original order sent on 01/04/2023 to petitioner amended only for defendant Andrea Field with a signature of Judge O'Neil Williams signed on 01/03/2023 and Judge Surendran Patel on 06/12/2023 within five months difference between each other and when the original order was never signed by Judge O'Neil Williams, which was the point of petitioner argument for the appeal, having an order signed by a judge who never heard the case.
