Jamal Eleidy seeks to appeal the sentence imposed following his guilty plea to conspiracy to commit bank fraud, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1349. The Government has moved to dismiss the appeal as barred by Eleidy's waiver of the right to appeal included in the plea agreement. Upon review of the record, we conclude that Eleidy knowingly and voluntarily waived his right to appeal and that the issues Eleidy seeks to raise on appeal fall squarely within the scope of his waiver of appellate rights. Accordingly, we grant the Government's motion to dismiss.
