

MEMORANDUM

Petitioners Brady, Bias, Insufficient Evidence and Ineffective Assistance of Counsel for both trial and appellate counsel, has been presented in every lower court and satisfy the exhaustion standard.

According to rule 44 this honorable court is able to grant rehearing due to the lower courts ignoring these claims is a substantial circumstance that intervened a proper ruling had these claims been addressed in prior judgments this honorable court would have had jurisdiction to grant or deny certiorari on these claims.

Lastly according to sup. ct. R. 16.3 this honorable court is able to suspend order denying certiorari simply because if the lower court had

taken action rather then ignoring claims there would be an adverse affect on review available in favor of Petitioner. Additionally the lower courts did not apply a rigorous analysis by refusing to address claims. Petitioner is asking this honorable court to evaluate the constitutionality of the governments determination. Petitioner is asking this honorable court to liberally construe this application, and do to these facts there is a reasonable likelihood of the court reversing its previous position and granting certiorari. Petitioner ask that this honorable court or Justice Kavanaugh suspend and order denying certiorari pending disposition of this application for rehearing.

CONCLUSION


