presented in good faith and not for delay.

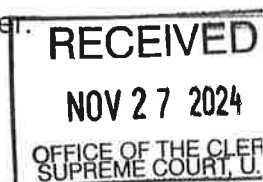
I shall do my Due Diligence trying to find a printer to produce 40 copies in Supreme Court rules

INTERVENING CIRCUMSTANCES OF COMPELLING NATURE

1. Washington DC US Federal District Court granted IFP in case 23-1820, underlying case 23-7018.
2. Court of Federal Claims granted IFP in directly related case 23-654
3. Washington DC district court's Order 7.12.24. was to be filed under seal by the petitioner.
4. Respondents never filed Brief in opposition.
5. IRS documents in support of affidavit of indigence, and unlawfully confined status of



Petitioner in 2023 and 2024 during this case.

6. This case's merit presents national interest by subsuming matters from four different Circuits with the same litigants names; Circuit splits in deciding IFP status of indigent detainee -never afforded Due Process Jury Trial -among other Constitutional violations warrant this Honorable Court's attention.
7. Habeas Corpus is buried within this case, interstate child abuse of Court protected minor by his dead beat dad is also buried in this case, and covered up under the government privilege seal, while petitioner and her son are repeatedly thrown in unlawful confinement in retaliation for initiating this case.
8. 10.14.24. Habeas Corpus submitted to US Supreme Court was never filed, or returned for correction, and if it was filed or returned, letters from the Clerk re: status of Extraordinary Writ of Habeas Corpus never arrived, nor were inquiry phone calls returned. USPS from all Courts in this case is routinely stolen by the opposition necessitating costly trips to the capital by indigent petitioner (staying in shelters and safe houses for DV survivors) for the only purpose of confirming status of her submissions.
9. Prima Facie Irreparable Harm to the Plaintiff and her son has already occurred from whistleblowers retaliation confinements of the Plaintiff and kidnapping of the son by the opposition, with ultimate harm openly and repeatedly promised as guaranteed.
10. 11.4.24. standard for per curiam dismissal has been termed controversial by leading legal authorities and dissented from by Hon. Justices Stevens and Blackmun in the 11.4.24. referenced Martin v. District of Columbia Court of Appeals, 506 U.S.1(1992) published per curiam opinions.
11. \$200 fee for rehearing is enclosed.



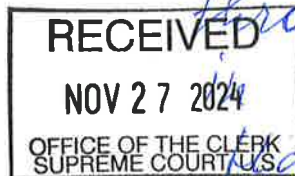

STEVENS, J., dissenting

of those petitioners who have not abused our certiorari process.

It is so ordered.

JUSTICE STEVENS, with whom JUSTICE BLACKMUN joins, dissenting.

In my opinion the judicial resources of the Court could be used more effectively by simply denying Martin's petitions than by drafting, entering, and policing the order the Court enters today. The theoretical administrative benefit the Court may derive from an order of this kind is far outweighed by the shadow it casts on the great tradition of open access that characterized the Court's history prior to its unprecedented decisions in *In re McDonald*, 489 U. S. 180 (1989) (*per curiam*), and *In re Sindram*, 498 U. S. 177 (1991) (*per curiam*). I continue to adhere to the views expressed in the dissenting opinions filed in those cases, and in the dissenting opinion I filed in *Zatko v. California*, 502 U. S. 16, 18 (1991) (*per curiam*). See also *Talamini v. Allstate Ins. Co.*, 470 U. S. 1067 (1985), appeal dism'd (STEVENS, J., concurring).
