I am a substitute teacher for Shawnee Heights USD 450 in which I live by the telephone meaning that if I get a phone call from the central office informing me that a substitute teacher is needed at a particular school I will have a job on that particular day. If I do not get a phone call I will not have a job to do meaning that my monthly paychecks will vary each month..

All USD 450 employees get paid on the last working day of each month with the cut off date is always on the 15th of each month. We get paid on the last working day of each month.

The 2024-2025 school year for USD 450 started on 8/13/2024 (Tues.) and I got to substitute on 8/16/2024 (Fri.) which is one day after the cut off date meaning that I will not get a paycheck for the month of August 2024. My first paycheck will come on September 30th 2024 (Mon.)

My paychecks from USD 450 will vary due to the number of times that I get a call to substitute. The pay for a whole day is \$125.00 and the pay for a half day is \$65.00 I will not know my pay until Sept. 30th 2024 depending on the number of days that I get a call from now up to September 13th 2024 (Fri.) because September 15th is on a Sunday. There is no school on Saturday or Sunday.

Again, my monthly paychecks from Shawnee Heights USD 450 will vary due to the number of times that I get a phone call that a substitute is needed for that particular day for it may be a full day or a half day.

On the weekends Saturday and Sunday I work part time at the Dillons Grocery Store where the employees get paid once a week which is on every Thursday. My weekly net income for this is \$108.21 and my monthly net income for this is \$472.84 for 2024-2025

All teachers are placed on a 12 month yearly contract meaning that He/She will also get paid for the summer months of June, July and August when there is no school. A contract teacher is also given benefits where as a substitute teacher is not given any kind of contract and not given benefits. As I mentioned in my Petition For Writ Of Certiorari I have been a contract teacher for USD 501 for 16 years that allowed me to have a steady reliable income.

Without myself not being on a 12 month yearly contract and only to have my Social Security, KPERS and Dillons as my reliable sources of income is not enough to cover the costs of this case. I also want to point out the following information which is of importance:

A.) On 4/18/2018 (Wed.) Mrs. Carla Nolan Former USD 501 Human Resource Director gave deposition testimony that if the school district could have demonstrated cause for non-renewal of Mr. Brown's contract it would have done so but we did not

B.) On 4/18/2018 (Wed.) Mrs. Carla Nolan Former USD 501 Human Resource Director gave deposition testimony that the many years Mr. Brown worked for USD 501 he was continually granted contract renewal

C.) On the date of 4/19/1995 is my last teacher evaluation with USD 501 and it is marked "Renew Contract"
