## MOTION FOR LEAVE TO DISPENSE WITH PREPARATION OF A JOINT APPENDIX

Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 26.8, Petitioners move for leave to dispense with the requirement of a joint appendix in this case. Respondents agree that a joint appendix is not necessary.

This case presents the question whether the petitioners plausibly alleged Article III standing. Petitioners' factual allegations are contained in their complaint and the individual petitioners' declarations, all of which are reproduced in the appendix to the petition for a writ of certiorari, along with the opinions of the lower courts and the relevant constitutional and statutory provisions. The parties agree that no other portion of the record merits special attention that warrants the preparation and expense of a joint appendix, and that preparation of a joint appendix would not materially assist the Court in its consideration of the case.

For the foregoing reasons, the motion to dispense with the preparation of a joint appendix should be granted.
