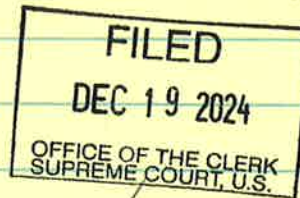

Dear Chief Justice

On or about November 29, 2024, I received the Court's order denying the Petition I filed in the above stated case number. On or about December 17, 2024, I timely filed a Motion for Reconsideration. A recent check of the Court's public records docket, my family noticed that the recently filed Motion was not docketed or marked as received. At my timely ~~written~~ ^{written} request pursuant to Rule 44.1 of the Supreme Court Rules. I am seeking reversal of the Court's prior decision on the grounds that the 16th Circuit Solicitor's Office failed to indict in compliance with the statutory requirements Title 14-5-820

As outlined in my Motion, the failure to adhere to the legislative statute in question constitutes a jurisdictional flaw. Title 14-5-820 (1) clearly mandates a specific structured procedure for indictment in such cases, and the failure of the 16th Circuit Solicitor's Office to follow this statute undermines the validity of the case brought before the general sessions. It is my position that, because the indictment was not issued in accordance with the statute, the general sessions court lacked subject matter jurisdiction over the matter, rendering the proceedings and course subsequent decisions invalid.

The jurisdictional defect in the grand jury proceedings presents a fundamental legal error that warrants reconsideration as a matter and question of law. I respectfully ask that the Court review the timely filed Motion in light of the statutory oversight and jurisdictional issue raised.
