

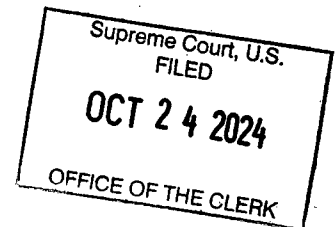

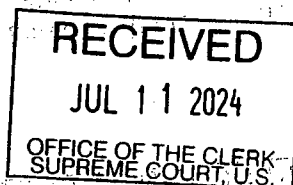

In the last 12 months I have not receive any incomes and the state of Texas issue an order to destroy my house property own by Humanity for wisdom that I use as rental income, As such Elegant Happy LLC a income property manager. I don't have nobody to entrust payments. I am incarcerated I don't have access to the bank to issue checks, money orders I can't do nothing, sell nothing, pay nothing. I work alone my whole career life. I never need anything from anyone, contact attorney(s) pay my hand absolutely nothing. I am stuck in jail and I lost everything for how difficult it is to have access to anything.

In the best of my knowledge I lost everything I can't even pay the illegal second \$30,000 bond. It is not a question of affordability. It is a question if I am capable to do it. The answer is I cannot do nothing. I am stuck in jail. I do not have access to cards, checks, banks, nothing. Even a homeless person can go outside beg for \$300 filing fee. It is not affordability, it is if I am capable to do it. The answer is not in jail is impossible to do anything. I am lockdown 23hrs per day in a cell.
