**EMERGENCY MOTION FOR SUPERVISORY ORDER PURSUANT TO ILLINOIS**

**SUPREME COURT RULE 383**

NOW COMES the Plaintiff, Ana Ortiz, proceeding pro se, and respectfully petitions this Honorable Court to issue a Supervisory Order pursuant to Illinois Supreme Court Rule 383, and to expedite the proceedings due to the urgent nature of the case. In support thereof, Plaintiff states as follows:

1. **Order of Protection:** On October 1, 2024, the Lake County Circuit Court - 19th Judicial Court entered an order of protection against Plaintiff Ana Ortiz, effectively preventing Plaintiff from any contact with her children.
2. **Appeals and Denials:** Subsequent to the entry of said order, Plaintiff has pursued four appeals in the Appellate Court of Illinois, Second District, and the Supreme Court of Illinois, all of which have been denied due to Plaintiff's pro se status in case 18D1696.
3. **Unjust Incarceration:** During the course of attempting to protect her parental rights and challenge the aforementioned orders, Plaintiff was unjustly incarcerated. This incarceration further exacerbates the immediate and irreparable harm and underscores the complexity and severity of the issues at hand.
4. **Violation of Sixth Amendment:** As established in *Gideon v. Wainwright*, the Sixth Amendment guarantees the right to counsel in criminal cases. This principle extends to civil cases involving fundamental rights, such as parental rights. Plaintiff's inability to afford legal representation in this complex case undermines the fairness and integrity of the judicial proceedings.
5. **Judicial Misconduct:** Plaintiff alleges that the presiding judges in cases 18D1696 engaged in fraudulent conduct by entering false "agreed" orders to protect the financial interests of the appointed Guardian ad litem.
6. **Due Process Violations:** The presiding judges egregiously violated Plaintiff's due process rights by refusing to consider crucial evidence and witness testimonies, and by making prejudicial statements in open court. The order of protection entered in case 24OP1898 against Ana Ortiz's violated her due process because of her inability to defend

herself and denial of counsel , further exacerbates the violation of her due process rights, particularly given the complexity of the case and the potential for irreparable harm.

7. **Erroneous Appellate Court Ruling:** The Appellate Court of Illinois has erroneously held that Plaintiff cannot appeal the contested orders on the grounds that they were "agreed," despite Plaintiff's assertions and supporting evidence to the contrary.
8. **Relief Under Rule 60:** Illinois Supreme Court Rule 60 provides relief from judgments obtained through fraud. Given the fraudulent nature of the judicial orders in question, Plaintiff seeks a declaration voiding every order issued since 2020 in the implicated cases.

**WHEREFORE,** Plaintiff prays that this Honorable Court grant the following relief:

- a. Issue a Supervisory Order under Illinois Supreme Court Rule 383 to void all orders issued by the Lake County Circuit Court - 19th Judicial Court against Plaintiff Ana Ortiz filed in 2020 in cases numbered 18D1696 and 24OP1898, specifically which is an order of protection entered on October 1, 2024.
