





## LIREN WANG ATTACHMENT To QUESTION #11 And #12

I first filed to US Supreme Court on 11/12/20224. I paid Office Depot \$1270.02 on 11/8/2024 to make 46 copies of my Writ of Certiorari and 45 binding of them (40 to file and 6 copies to serve to two respondents). I paid USPS \$129.45 on 11/12/2025 for mailing them to US Supreme Court using Priority Mail. I also paid USPS twenty to thirty dollars (I forget the exact postage paid) to serve 6 copies of my Writ to 2 defendants. So the total cost I paid to Office Depot and USPS for this case was more than \$1399.47.

At that time my Writ only has 32 pages excluding appendix and the complete Writ with appendix has 101 pages. Now I was told my filing doesn't comply with the rules of US Supreme Court and I have to change font and line space for both the Writ and its appendixes so now the same Writ has 52 pages by simply changing the font and line space and the complete Writ and its appendixes after font and line space change has 130 pages . It definitely will cost more than \$1270.02 if I make 46 copies and 45 binding of them again and more than \$129.45 to mail the new 40 copies to US Supreme Court.

As a citizen without any income and live on limited saving and credit card, I cannot afford to spend another \$1399.47 plus for this case. That's why I am respectfully asking for granting my MOTION FOR LEAVE TO PROCEED IN FORMA PAUPERIS.
