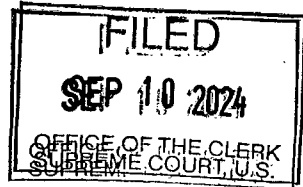

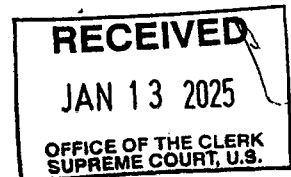

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

On March 12, 2020 the supervisor for SEFA Cory Robinson called me and told me to go by Winyah Star Plant to pick up a load of bad wet ash to take to Oak Ridge landfill junkyard. And I went to Winyah Star Plant to pick it up. The trailer he told me to get was not my trailer; it was already loaded. And when I hooked my truck to it and went and got on the scale to weigh it before I took it on the highway it had 99,740 in the trailer. The trailer was overweight and I called Cory Robinson the supervisor, and told him, he needed to talk to the people at Winyah Star Plant over loading the trailer with the bad wet ash, and wanting us to pick it up and take it to Oak Ridge landfill whenever they call us to do it. So I went back to the pad to dump some out of the trailer to get it to the right weight. The right weight would be 79,500 or either 80,200. And I called Cory Robinson the supervisor and all he told me was to write my time down when I get back to the SEFA Plant in Georgetown. So on the 13th of March, 2020, I took the load of bad wet ash to Oak Ridge landfill junkyard and when I got there, the loader was pushing the bad wet ash up and he told me to bring my truck closer to him so I can dump the bad wet ash out for him. And when I went to lift the bed to dump the bad wet ash out, the truck turned over on the right side of me.

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

And I called Cory Robinson the supervisor and told him what happened. And he told me he was coming to me because none of SEFA Supervisors knew where OakRidge landfill was at before Cory got to me, Tommy from St. George Plant came to me first and he looked at the truck and trailer and told me it looked like whoever loaded the truck put too much bad wet ash on one side of the trailer to cause the truck to turn over. And Tommy did not know that I had told Cory about the truck being overloaded, and he already knew what caused it to turn over. And Jody Neuroth came to me next the Safety man for SEFA And he looked at it and told me that the ground was leveled where I was dumping the bad wet ash out. And Cory Robinson the supervisor came to me next and asked me to write my report And I wrote my report and gave it to Cory Robinson the supervisor and he called me back and told me he needed to write another report on what happened because he gave Jody Neuroth the safety man my report. And I told him I had already gave him my report.

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

And he wrote a report behind my back to Billy Bronson and Tiffani Peak that I was unsafe on the job and drove SEFA truck unsafe. And they fired me all because of a lie. Saying that I did not report the Overweight truck. To any SEFA supervisor And lied to South Carolina Unemployment and Workforce saying I had a misconduct on the job. Denied my Unemployment benefit And I was hurt on the job at the same time and denied my workers comp. And cancelled my medical insurance during the pandemic all because of a lie And attorney's Steven A. Jordan and Grant M. Wills know that the evidence doesn't match, and the judges do too, but are still agreeing with them. On the lie And the Worker's Comp. attorney E. Hood Temple proved to Allison Nausbaum and SEFA Transportation that they wrongfully terminated me. And to the South Carolina Worker's Compensation Commissioner at the hearing and it was unjustified how SEFA Transportation fired me in the midst of COVID-19.

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

And I was fired the same day the school sent my daughter home due to COVID-19. And I was hurt on the job at the same time and the doctor was treating me while I was hurt, and they stopped me from seeing the doctor. I went to the doctor on the appointment he told me to come and see him he told me he couldn't see me because SEFA Transportation stopped it. And they denied my worker's comp benefits during COVID-19. And lied to the South Carolina Unemployment and Workforce that I had a misconduct on the job. And I had 14 years on the job working for SEFA Transportation for them to have outrageous hate behavior like that to me, and I didn't do anything wrong but did what the supervisor told me to do. And it was unjustified how South Carolina Unemployment and Workforce believed SEFA Transportation lie and I wrote them several letters telling them the truth and they denied my unemployment benefits during COVID-19. While all of them were getting paid during COVID-19, while I didn't have any money to support my family during COVID-19. That's why I was suing

South Carolina Unemployment and Workforce for my benefits they denied me during COVID-19 and ~~that's~~ why I was suing SEFA Transportation for lost wages and wrongful termination.

And after SEFA Transportation fired me, Cory Robinson the supervisor for SEFA Transportation called me on March 17th and told me that it was wrong how Tiffany Peak and Billy Bronson fired me and it was heartbroken what they did to me. And he was the one that wrote the bad report for me to be fired. And SEFA Transportation Inc. stopped all the the trucks like I was driving from coming into Oakridge landfill junkyard. And started putting the bad wet ash on a belt trailer that spins the bad wet ash out.

They know that the bad wet ash caused the truck to turn over but they couldn't do nothing to Senator Cooper, because they own the Winyah Star Plant. So they framed me, and lied and said I was unsafe and fired me because I was black. And my attorney E. Hood Temple called me on a Sunday and told me that SEFA Transportation Inc. was going to lie and say that I was unsafe on the job, because they couldn't fire me just to fire me.

And my attorney E. Hood Temple double-crossed me for SEFA because SEFA bribed him after he called and told me that and won't tell the truth to Steven A. Jordan and Grant M. Wills and to the Court.
