



Petitioner was detained by police for investigation of theft. Police searched the vehicle Petitioner had been in and found a handgun and ammunition. Petitioner told the police that he was old and had the firearm for protection. Petitioner was indicted for a violation of Sec. 46.04, Texas Penal Code. The underlying felony conviction was a conviction for the offense of Possession of a Controlled Substance Under One Gram, Penalty Group One (state jail felony). The State subsequently filed a new indictment with a conviction for the offense of Aggravated Assault with Deadly Weapon (second degree felony) as the underlying felony conviction. Petitioner filed a pretrial habeas corpus, pursuant to Art. 11.08, Code of Criminal Procedure. The trial court, Hon. Doug Allen, judge of Criminal District Court Number Three, Tarrant County, Texas denied relief in case number C-0011658 on August 15, 2024. Petitioner appealed to the Second Court of Appeals in Fort Worth. The Second Court of Appeals denied relief in case number 02-24-00282-CR on December 19, 2024. Petitioner's Petition for Discretionary Review was denied by the Court of Criminal Appeals in case number PD-0036-25 on March 12, 2025. Petitioner alleges that Section 46.04, Texas Penal Code violates the Second Amendment and is unconstitutional under New York State Rifle and Pistol Association, Inc. v. Bruen, 597 U.S. 1 (2022).
